

Invitation to Apply for two Fellowships in Comparative Cultural Studies

Harvard's Center for Hellenic Studies (CHS) is pleased to offer two fellowships to junior faculty members (Lecturers or Assistant Professors) and Scientific and Laboratory Teaching Staff who hold a PhD (" $E\Delta\Pi$ " and " $EE\Pi$ "), from Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences of Greek Universities.

This year's cycle of the fellowship program in Comparative Cultural Studies runs under the topic "Outsiders and Insiders: Identity, Agency, and Inclusivity in the Humanities and Social Sciences". Applicants should submit proposals of research topics revolving around the key issues of self and other, inclusion or exclusion from social processes, through rewards or stigmatization, either in the arts (literature, theatre, cinema, and the visual arts) or the social sciences (history, social studies, political science). Preference will be given to inventive and original research questions, as well as proposals addressing contemporary issues from a comparative perspective.

As part of their one-year appointment (June 1, 2021–May 31, 2022), fellows will be invited to present their proposed project to the CHS research community on a date to be determined according to their availability.

The fellowship includes:

- Year-long appointment as CHS Fellow in Comparative Cultural Studies in Greece.
- Year-long access to all Harvard electronic resources. The fellows receive an ID and HarvardKey to access all digital libraries, available through the Harvard University library system.
- Invitation in events to present their research.
- Invitation to present their profile and research project on CHS websites, social and other media.
- A support of up to €2000 as a research fund. Additionally, CHS will cover travel expenses (transportation and accommodation) for all the events/activities related to their CHS fellowship.

All prospective applicants must submit the following (all documents in English) by April 8, 2021 at midnight (Eastern European Time):

- A curriculum vitae
- A brief research proposal indicating how their proposed project is connected to the topic "Outsiders and Insiders: Identity, Agency and Inclusivity in the Humanities and Social Sciences" (no more than 600 words). Bibliographies and references do not count toward the word limit.
- Additionally, all prospective applicants should provide contact details for one letter of reference.
